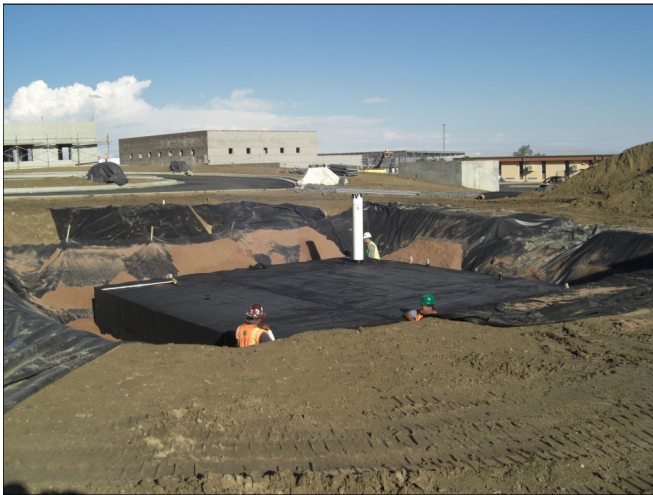


# ECORAIN™ TANK SYSTEMS CASE STUDY

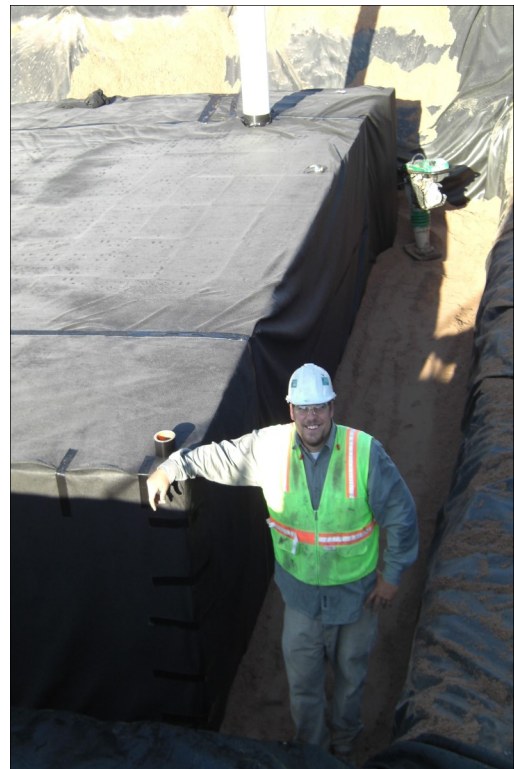
## CISTERNS

### Navajo Nation Rough Rock Community School, Arizona

The Navajo Nation has chosen EcoRain Tanks to harvest rain water from the roofs of Rough Rock Community School. Always a leader, Rough Rock - Tse Ch'zhi - was built in 1966 as the first community-run school in the U.S. The School and the U.S. Bureau of Indian Affairs have chosen EcoRain Tanks for the first cisterns in the area to provide 100% irrigation needs.



- Two 32,000 gallon cisterns designed to supply 100% irrigation water via pumps and drip systems. When rain water supply runs low—the Tanks fill with potable water.
- LEED Silver Certification pending approval.
- 100% recycled Polypropylene materials.
- EcoRain Tanks are wrapped with Geotextile Material & placed on top and sides with sand, inside a liner to filter water..
- Local General Contractor Warner's Landscape Company hired and worked with local Native Americans who built and operate the Cisterns.
